

Dear ATU brothers and sisters,

Yesterday, an unimaginable and *completely unnecessary* act of senseless gun violence took place in the light rail yard of the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (SCVTA). TEN *totally innocent* victims of this appalling, cowardly act (including the deceased shooter) are dead. They are brothers from our ATU Local 265 in San Jose/Santa Clara.

This horrible assault on these hard-working, dedicated frontline workers—our ATU brothers! —took place just after 6:30 a.m., during the busy shift changes. So far, no one—law enforcement, ATU co-workers, and Local 265 officers—have any clear motive for this atrocity. Media reports suggest the shooter (I do not want to even dignify him with a name) was angry with his family, co-workers and maybe his job itself.

Whatever the twisted motive, nothing—absolutely nothing—can remotely justify this tragedy, the lost lives and careers, and the devastated families!
